

NAC Senior Spanish Club

MISSION STATEMENT:

The purpose of the NAC Senior Spanish Club is to:

1. Deepen each student's awareness of Hispanic culture, as well as other ethnic cultures, Spanish-speaking countries, including the U.S., and other countries.
2. To offer students in the Senior Spanish Club the opportunity to host Spanish-speaking students at NAC as guest visitors during the school day, to promote the idea of learning languages as a vital tool in our modern society where cultures are in daily contact with each other.
3. To promote the idea of cross-cultural communication, via guest speakers, pen pal correspondence, field trips, and hosting international students and other visitors.
4. To develop interest in studying Spanish as a tool for communication, both in the USA and outside the US, recognizing that Spanish is the second language of the USA, and as such, is a viable work tool for business, industry and educational purposes.

ELIGIBILITY:

The Senior Spanish Club is open to all students in grades 9-12 who maintain good academic standing and good standing with the school in general. Elected officers will be chosen from grades 11-12. Elected officers and advisors would have the right to deny entry to those that they feel would be too immature or not serious enough through a majority vote. Participation in field trips would be at the discretion of the advisor(s), depending on academic standing, behavior and maturity.

BY-LAWS:

1. Members must attend meetings on a regular basis. A member must attend 75% of the meetings held by the Senior Spanish Club.
2. Members must work together in a cooperative manner. The officers and faculty advisors would have the right to discipline the members. All warnings will be officially recorded, along with the reason for the warning. After three warnings the member would face being banned from the club. The decision would be put to a majority vote by the officers and faculty advisor.
